The Erasmus+ programme 2021-2027

- **A great opportunity!**
- €28 billion (2021-2027)
 - Funding for schools and other educational institutions
 - Simplified procedure: it is worth applying now for new comers and less experienced organisations!!
- **Why to participate?**
 - Learn new skills and knowledge
 - Find new resources
 - Transfer to practice
 - Network and influence

Who can participate

- Organisations:
 - The applicant must be an organisation
 - Only organisations can apply, not individuals
 - **Any education level:** pre-primary, primary, secondary schools, VET and adult education, higher education institutions
 - Based in EU + Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, North Macedonia, Turkey and Serbia UK government opted out of the Erasmus+ scheme (Brexit)
- Participants can be teachers and staff (and students!)

Getting your OID

- OID = Organisation ID. It identifies organisations in Erasmus+ projects

Erasmus+ fields

- Erasmus+ covers many “fields” :
 - school education
 - vocational education and training (VET)
 - adult education
 - higher education
 - youth
 - sport
- Contact [your Erasmus+ National Agency](#) if you are unsure what field your organisation belongs to

Key Actions and their activities

• Key Action 1 = mobility

• Staff mobility

- Job shadowing (2 to 60 days)
- Teaching assignments (2 to 365 days)

MAIN FOCUS

• Course and training (2 to 30 days)

• Learner mobility

POSSIBLE
(easy)

- Group mobility of school pupils (2 to 30 days, at least 2 pupils per group)
- Short-term learning mobility of pupils (10 to 29 days)
- Long-term learning mobility of pupils (30 to 365 days)

• Other supported activities

- Invited experts (2 to 60 days)
- Hosting teachers and educators in training (10 to 365 days)
- Preparatory visits

• Key Action 2 = cooperation

• Partnership for cooperation

- Cooperation partnership projects

MAIN FOCUS

• Small-scale partnership projects

- Partnership for excellence
- Partnership for innovation
- Alliances for Innovation
- Capacity building
- Sport events

• Key Action 3 = policy

• Jean Monnet Actions = training about EU matters

... and so much more (Teacher academies, etc)

Key Action 1 activities: “Course and training”

- For **teachers and staff**
- Course duration: **one week**
- [Our teacher training courses:](#)
 - Language learning and teaching
 - School innovation and management
 - Methodologies and practices
 - STEM and digital education
 - Arts, well-being and culture
 - Global citizenship education
- Funding for teacher training courses: approx. 2500€ per participant
 - It covers all costs: course fees, activities, accommodation, meals, travel, etc

How to participate to Key Action 1 mobilities

- **1 - Apply for funding**

- Short-term mobility projects (KA122) ← **MAIN FOCUS**
- Accredited projects accreditation (KA120)+ budget request (KA121)

- **2 - Join without an application**

- Join a mobility consortium (Ask your NA and please recommend us)
- Host Erasmus+ participants

Short-term mobility projects (KA122)

- Project duration from 6 to 18 months
- Maximum 30 mobilities per project
- Maximum 3 projects in 5 years time
- One project per round (per field!)
- Priority to new comer and less experienced organisations

- Unlimited number
- 2-5 pages

- **FREE online consultation sessions**

- Every 2 feedback reports

Time commitment and deadlines for KA122

TIME COMMITMENT

- **30-50 hours**

4 webinars (1h each) + 3-5h between one webinar and the other + discussions with your team

DEADLINES

- November:
 - Call is published
- **February:**
 - Key Action 1 Mobility projects – first round
- **October:**
 - Possible Key Action 1 Mobility projects – second round: (but depends on National Agency, not confirmed)
- Results are published in the summer and activities can start from September or later

Key Action 2: Small-scale partnerships (KA210)

- 3-4 partners from different countries
- Project-based activities led by partners:
 - developing or piloting educational materials such as toolkits or guides;
 - organising online meetings with teachers and students;
 - attending teacher training courses or workshops
 - Usually 2-3
 - mobility is not the focus
 - engaging in digital practices with other organisations
 - and much more!

- Funding for KA210: Lump sums: 30.000€ or 60.000€

How to participate to Key Action 2 partnerships

- Identify your objectives
- Find partners
- Develop a project proposal
- Prepare and submit the application

- ... usually very complex!

What support we can provide for KA210

- **FREE Partner selection**

- Joining phase:
 - Quiz
 - Partner information form

- **FREE Mutual interest**

- Swiping phase: expressing preference

- **FREE Matching**

- Matching phase:
 - Project idea and budget
 - Professionally written application draft
 - Signature of application annexes

Time commitment and deadlines for KA210

TIME COMMITMENT

- **We recommend getting involved in at least 2-3 KA210 applications or more**
- Examples:
 - up to **10 hours in TOTAL** for you to contribute to **2** finalised applications
 - up to **20 hours in TOTAL** for you to contribute to **5** finalised applications

DEADLINES

- November:
 - Call is published
- **March:**
 - Key Action 2 Small-scale partnerships – first round
- October:
 - Possible Key Action 2 Small-scale partnerships – second round: (but depends on National Agency, not confirmed)
- Results are published in the summer and activities can start from September or later

Key differences between KA122 and KA210

	KA122 Short-term mobility project	KA210 Small-scale partnership
Focus	Mobility	Cooperation
Max number of mobilities	30	2 or 3, but they shouldn't be the focus of the project
Activity types	Teacher training courses Other activities	Project-based activities about specific topics to promote innovation, exchange of experience and know-how between different types of organisations
Funding	Approx 2500 € per mobility	Lump sums: 30.000 € or 60.000 €
Time commitment	We estimate it takes 30-50 hours to prepare an application + time to meet up with your team	We estimate it takes 10 hours to contribute to two (2) applications or 20 hours to contribute to five (5) applications + time to meet up with your team
Deadlines	First round: February Possible second round: October	First round: March Possible second round: October
Support we provide	Webinars Feedback reports 30-min consultations (after 2 reports)	Joining: partner selection Swiping: mutual interest Matching: idea, draft, signatures
How many applications	If you are new to Erasmus+ or have limited experience, we recommend submitting one KA122 application AND getting involved in at least 2-3 (or more) KA210 applications.
