

Course title	An inclusive classroom: how to give equal access and resources to all students

Course category	School innovation and management
Course purpose and overview	Promoting inclusive education is one of the strategic objectives for co-operation in education and training at the EU-level. The first principle of the European Pillar of social rights underlines that: "Everyone has the right to quality and inclusive education, training and life-long learning in order to maintain and acquire skills that enable them to participate fully in society and manage successfully transitions in the labour market". Inclusive education is a way to give all children a chance to go to school, learn, and develop the skills they need to thrive. The course will be made up of activities, discussions, and self-reflection moments to define what inclusion means and why it is important in education. It will give you the resources and the competencies to prepare and implement inclusion processes within your class and equip you how to tailor lesson plans in consideration of the needs of all students. Moreover, the possibility to talk to and share best practices with teachers of other countries will enable you to learn how inclusion is perceived and implemented in other school systems around Europe. You will discuss and learn new management approaches, strategies, methodologies, and instruments observed in educational contexts with various legal and institutional backgrounds. Finally, find out about what actions, toolkits, and initiatives the Commission is implementing in this field. Ideally, this course should foster increased sharing and learning partnerships and potentially form reliable partnerships leading to possible future Erasmus+ projects. Participants will learn from each other and share best practices and ideas about
	inclusion, so that the impact can be felt in your classroom and beyond!
Course structure and content	The course "An inclusive classroom: how to give equal access and resources to all students" is designed to provide participants with the necessary knowledge and practical skills to promote inclusive education within their classrooms and schools. The course will consist of a combination of interactive activities, group discussions, self-reflection moments, and practical workshops to ensure a
	comprehensive learning experience.
