



GETTING IN ROME

By car

To reach the center of Rome you need to pass through the motorway A90 called also Grande Raccordo Anulare (GRA) a circular motorway that surrounds the entire city. Once in the center pay attention to the several **ZTL zone**, areas in which car traffic is restricted. Please check [this website](#) for information on the restricted areas.

By train

Rome is a central railway node for the entire country. Many lines converge into “Roma Termini” the city’s central station, notably from:

- **Venezia** (it usually includes a stop in Florence and Bologna): four hours ride;
- **Bologna**: two hours and a half ride;
- **Milano**: four hours ride;
- **Napoli**: 1 hour.

From Termini Railway Station to the city center:

- **by taxi**: taxi waiting area in front of the station or call +39 060609 or use the app ChiamaTaxi 060609;
- **by bus**: there are several bus lines stopping near the station. Please check the official [webpage](#) for information on the buses and fees;
- **by metro**: both metro lines (A and B) stop at the station;
- **by foot**: in around 20 minutes you can reach some of the most famous monuments of Rome like the Colosseum or Trevi fountain.

By plane

Aeroporto Fiumicino, the main airport in Rome and the biggest in Italy. From this airport you can reach the center in the following ways:

- **by taxi** (from 50 minutes): taxi waiting area in front of the airport or call +39 060609 or use the app ChiamaTaxi 060609.
- **by bus**: there are several options to go from the airport to the city center by bus the duration is from 50 to more than 90 minutes depending on the traffic. Some of the bus options are:

- **by train**: in front of Terminal 3 you can find the train station of the airport. From here you can reach both Roma Termini (the main central station of the city) and Roma Tiburtina in around 30-40 minutes. Information on the timetable and trains are available on the [website](#).

Getting around the city

On foot

Rome is pretty big so it would be impossible to see all of it by foot. However, the majority of the monuments are within a walking distance of each other. By foot is also the best way to enjoy the small streets and the roman neighborhoods so it is certainly a recommended way to visit the city!

By Metro
