



GETTING IN PRAGUE

By car: Prague is centrally located in Europe and can be reached easily from several countries like Austria, Germany, Poland, Slovakia and Hungary. The best way to reach the city is to use Highway 0 which surrounds the city.

By train: Prague's main train station is located in the city centre, from there you can reach the old town square in around 20 minutes by foot. The train station is well connected to the rest of the city by public transport. You can find information for all the public transportation in the same <u>webpage</u>.

By plane:

Prague Airport (PRG), is the only airport of the city. From this airport you can reach the centre in the following ways:

- by taxi: you can find a taxi in the waiting area outside of the airport. You can also book an Uber by using the official app or through the Uber kiosk available inside the airport.
- **by bus:** there are several lines connecting the airport with the city's main central station or the





subway lines "B" and "A" respectively, that can be used to reach pretty anywhere in the city. More information on the available buses can be find on the following <u>webpage</u>.

Getting around the city

By foot: the historical city centre and the main tourist attraction are all within walking distance. However, Prague is quite big so for some parts you will need to use the public transport.

By public transport: Prague's public transport consists of three lines of Metro, trams and buses serving more or less the entire city. You can find information for all the public transportation in the same <u>webpage</u>.
